On the Inside out-of-work list we have 16 on Book 1, 39 on Book 2, 10 on Book 3, and 6 on Book 4. There is 1 on Book 1 for Sound & Comm, 1 on Book 2, 1 on Book 3, and 0 on book 4. There are 2 on CW Book 1 and 3 on CW Book 2. There are 3 Inside apprentice on the out-of-work list.

COVID-19 has changed us in ways we could not have imagined. One year ago we were planning our 50th anniversary. We celebrated the great history and

sacrifices of the men and women who formed Local 234. Although many of our plans and way of life has changed, we remain a strong and united family.

I am happy to report that we achieved over 450,000 work hours for the Inside Agreement for 2020. This represents an increase of over 50,000 work hours from 2019. The essential work of our members continues in the face of this awful pandemic. It is our members that lead the way and ensure our jobsites remain safe and productive..

The IBEW Sound & Communications Health and Welfare Program has partnered with BaySport to provide wellness services to Sound & Communication members, retirees, and benefited family members over 18. The Wellness program has announced their "Healthy Lifestyle Challenge 2021." The focus of this program is to help participants incorporate new habits that lead to an overall healthier lifestyle and improve wellness. The latest federal COVID-19 relief measure passed in December 2020 did not include an extension of the "Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act." Employers are no longer required to provide up to 80 hour of paid sick and family leave under the Families First Coronavirus Relief Act (FFCRA). The new CAL/OSHA Covid-19 Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) requires employers to "continue and maintain an employee's earnings, seniority, and all other employee rights and benefits." So if you are exposed to COVID-19 on the jobsite a contractor must continue to provide your pay and benefits while in quarantine.

The next Aptitude Test scheduled for February 20th and 27th has been postponed. The new more contagious strains of COVID-19 spreading across the country is a big concern of the JATC. Please ask those individuals interested in entering the apprenticeship to check the JATC website, www.tricountyjatc.org for updates. The JATC is also looking for new instructors. While red meat can increase your risk of cardiovascular disease, there are tons of red plant foods that'll keep your heart healthy!

	Tart Cherries NUTRIENT: Vitamin A	One cup of tart cherries has 39% of your daily vitamin A.

February Is Black History Month

Black History Month, or National African American History Month, is an annual celebration of achievements by black Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of African Americans in U.S. history. The effort to create the commemoration began in 1915. Harvard-trained historian Carter G. Woodson and the prominent minister Jesse E. Moorland founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH), an organization dedicated to researching and promoting achievements by black Americans and other peoples of African descent. Known today as the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH), the group sponsored a national Negro History week in 1926, choosing the second week of February to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglas.

In the decades that followed, mayors of cities across the country began issuing yearly proclamations recognizing Negro History week. By the late 1960s Negro History Week had evolved into Black History Month on many college campuses. President Gerald Ford officially recognized Black History Month in 1976, calling upon the public to “seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history.”

Curbside pick up is now available! Just call ahead to order and pay and then swing by to grab your new merchandise!

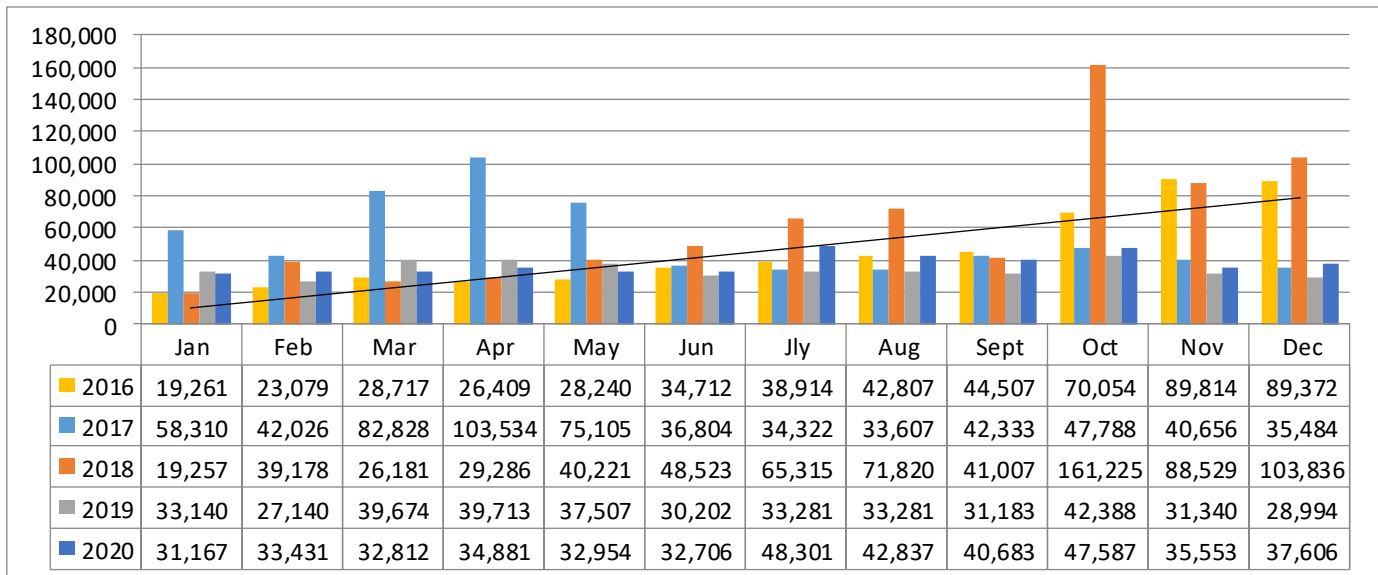

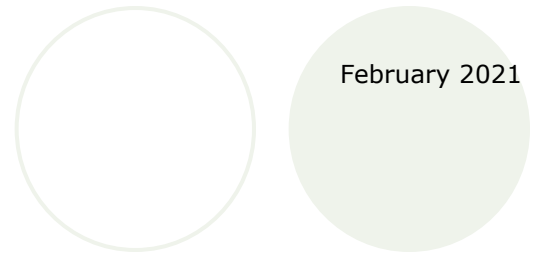

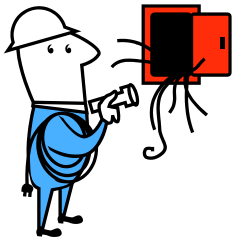
