Business Manager's Report by Lamont Adams

Sisters and Brothers,

On the Inside out-of-work list we have 21 on Book 1, 79 on Book 2, 10 on Book 3, and 6 on Book 4. There is 0 on Book 1 for Sound & Comm, 0 on Book 2, 0 on Book 3, and 0 on Book 4. There is 2 on CW Book 1 and 2 on CW Book 2. There is 1 Inside apprentices on the out-of-work list.

In 2021 the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) approved a historic decision ordering utilities to procure 11,500 megawatts (MW) of new electricity resources to come online between the

years of 2023 and 2026. This decision is a foundational investment in meeting the state's goal of 100 percent clean electricity by 2045. As a result Pacific Gas & Electric has proposed nine new battery storage projects amounting to 1,600 MW to help shore up the state's electrical grid. One of these projects include a 350 MW/1,400 MWh energy storage facility at the Moss Landing power plant. This project could eventually reach 1500 MW with additional phases being planned. This ensures that Local 234 will continue to play an important part in helping California reach its renewable energy goals. Our members have proven themselves already by installing over 450 MW of battery storage and look forward to continuing to use our expertise and knowledge to build any future projects right the first time, on schedule and under budget.

Article 15 Section 15 of the IBEW Constitution states that "each Local Union shall have a safety and health committee which shall: investigate and report serious accidents and fatalities; cooperate with the International Office on safety and health matters; promote safety and health; and cooperate with safety and health organizations as determined by the Local Union." Our safety committee is in need of more member

involvement. Please contact me if you are interested in getting involved and helping support our efforts to make the health and safety of everyone a priority at work and home.

I would also like to put out a call to all of Local 234's Veterans. I believe starting a Veteran's Committee for our Local would help encourage more participation and produce more opportunities to promote our Local in the community. If you are interested in leading or just participating in this new committee please contact me at your earliest convenience. The International Office is interested in spotlighting one Veteran from each District to be interviewed for a video that will be shown at the 40th IBEW International Convention.

Members should be receiving a notice from the Health and Welfare Plan containing information about over the counter COVID-19 test coverage. Starting, January 15th, the Plan will cover the cost of over the counter at-home COVID-19 diagnostic test authorized by the FDA at no cost to you. Members are subject to an eight test quantity limit per covered individual per 30-day period. Coverage for these test is intended for personal use and not for employment purposes.

The next JATC Aptitude Test is scheduled for Saturday, February 26th with our Test Administrator Terry Tatroe. Volunteer Proctors are needed. Contact the JATC at (831) 741-9069 if you are able to volunteer for the morning sessions, afternoon sessions, or both. Three Proctors are needed for each session.

National Electrical 401(k) Plan—NEFP

Saving for retirement is one of the most important things you can do to provide for your financial future!

We are so happy to see so many of you sign up for the new 401 (k) program!

Everyone should have received Welcome Packets in the mail and we highly encourage you to take part.

Make sure you hand in the elected deferred form to your Contractors.

Some key points to remember as you enroll:

- You are allowed to elect to defer \$2.00, \$5.00, or \$8.00 per hour **ONLY**. Although you may be allowed to chose other dollar amounts and/or a percentage on the contribution election page, those amounts will not be accepted.
- Selection changes may be done at dispatch and at the beginning of the January payroll period only.
- Participation is elective—you do not need to participate.

The 2022 contribution limit for elective deferrals is \$20,500 and the “catch-up” provision is \$6,500.00 for members who are 50 and over.




