

The wage allocation results are in, and the decision was unanimous: the full \$4.25 raise will be added to the journeyman rate. This means that the new journeyman rate is \$65.16 effective the last week of December 2023.

This decision reflects our dedication to fair wages, better working conditions, and a brighter future for all members of IBEW Local 234. Thank you for your engagement and for being an essential part of our Union's success.


