Get Annual Health Exam:

Eat a Healthy Diet: Eat lots of fresh fruit and vegetables. Decrease salt and saturated fat intake. Check out the <u>DASH</u> (<u>Dietary Approaches to Stop</u> Hypertension) eating plan, a proven healthy diet plan. Maintain Healthy Weight: If you know your weight and height, you can <u>calculate your</u> BMI at CDC's Assessing Your Weight website. Or talk with your doctor.

Be Physically Active: Adults should get 30 minutes a day of mod-intense exercise, like a brisk walk or bicycling. Visit the website for CĎC's Ďivision of Nutrition, Physical Activity, and Obesity for more

Limit How Much Alcohol You Drink: The recommendation for men is no more than two alcoholic drinks per day, and women no more than one alcoholic drink per day. A Call To Action from IBEW 234 Government Affairs—Ron Chesshire **Upcoming Elections and Your Future**

Local 234 Members, this Primary Election has been moved from its traditional date in June to March 5th. It has been done before and had been done to make the results in California relevant. All too often the results in June have no impact on who the Presidential candidates were going to be in the General Election, so they moved it up.

This year is important for us locally because it is local elections, which determine local



office holders, who make decisions affecting our work locally. There are 3 crucial elections in our jurisdiction which are of special importance because only 2 candidates are running, and whoever wins in March is the winner and does not have to go to a runoff in the General Election in November.

A past California Legislator once said, "Money is the Mother's Milk of Politics" and we are sure you are all familiar with the old adage, "Those with the Gold make the Rules". The point here is, as working people we cannot leave the outcome of elections to those who are more financially capable than us and expect them to treat us fairly.

Unions have always participated in elections. There was a time when Union members and their families would meet at the Hall

and actively engage in the day-to-day work of the various campaigns for those candidates they supported. During that time in history Unions gained political power and many of the laws that benefited working people were passed. Unfortunately, over time the will and ability to participate has dwindled and along with it, the power of Unions.

At local 234 we are turning the page on how things are and are working to make things better. We are reaching out to you, the members, asking for you to consider three (3) things: 1) Register to vote if you already haven't. Registering ensures your right to vote. You cannot vote if you are not registered. 2) Give up one (1) Saturday morning this year to participate in the election process by doing a precinct walk for one of the candidates the Local is supporting. Helping a candidate in this manner is worth its weight in gold. 3) Vote in the elections this year. Don't ever think your vote doesn't count. Many elections, especially local community ones, are won by small margins.

The Local has endorsed candidates and is giving donations to their campaigns but we assure you that their opponents are also receiving donations from their supporters. The rubber meets the road on the streets and that is where we need to be, helping those candidates we endorsed. Our power cannot be matched if we give of ourselves and invest that one morning in someone who will support us.


